## **Minutes of the 2021 AGM**

## **Matters Arising**

1/ The specimen award weights that had been discussed for so long would now be coming into effect as of 1<sup>st</sup> Dec 2022. It was noted that in the main our suggested weights had gone through, but not all of them. It was noted that the Small Eyed in area A still looked back to front! The only off set weights we would be using from the 1<sup>st</sup> Dec would be for Chub Mackerel and Couches Bream as these do not have their own weights.

2/ Don't forget that from 1<sup>st</sup> Dec we would only be having one FOM event each month. This would be for both catch and release and catch and keep. We would also return to a single record list. This was voted in at the 2021 AGM to start from the start of the new Wyvern year.

A big thank you to all the helpers who turned up to help on the day which was 13. In fact, they almost outnumbered the juniors. Considering only 4 of the 14 juniors were from Plymouth it was very disappointing. At the last Wyvern meeting it was decided to move next year's competition elsewhere.

The winner of the event was Evie Gallagher of Rodbenders SAC

Our Small Boat Competition fished out of Salcombe this year was once again fished in good weather, with the outer limit enforced for both days.

It was the 43rd year that the competition was organized by Wyvern.

The entry was 87 anglers fishing in 32 boats. Another good attendance in what seemed to be a reunion amongst old friends

5/ A quick discussion was had on sharks etc. The AT had asked if we agree halting the specimen award scheme for them until a better / safer way could be found moving forward. Mike had spoken to Eric Geery recently and he had confirmed it was for only large Sharks like Blue, Porbeagle etc and not smoothounds and spurs etc. K Tapper had sent through a chart that the Shark Angling Group use for weighing. It seemed ok but still needed a good measuring system in place.
